## III. PDF REGULATION

- 2) Do not exceed 30 MByte for one article.
- 3) Use PDF version 1.5 or under. (Acrobat 6 compatibility).
- 4) Do not make any protection for your PDF. All manuscripts are subject to be manipulated (putting page numbers, logo, etc.)
- 5) Do not leave local page numbers.
- 6) Please generate a PDF file with Letter size. Do not use A4 format. To specify the output paper type for PDF generator, refer a suitable guide.
- 7) Do not use `\hyperref`.
- 8) Remove bookmarks from your PDF file.
- 9) Before submission, please check the visual of your PDF file, e.g., margins, document size, embedded fonts, and so on.
